GET SUPPORT

- Call **VT 211** to find **RESOURCES** such as shelter and food as well as to report damage to your home, property, vehicles, equipment or possessions.
- Call or text [1-800-985-5990](tel:1-800-985-5990) to reach the **DISASTER DISTRESS HELPLINE** - a national hotline dedicated to providing year-round disaster crisis counseling. This toll-free, multilingual, crisis support service is available 24/7 to all residents in the U.S. who are experiencing emotional distress related to disasters.
- Reach out to your **MUTUAL AID/NEIGHBOR TO NEIGHBOR NETWORK** listed on our webpage.

REPORT DAMAGE

- To 211 by **CALLING 211** or using the webpage <https://vermont211.org/resident-form> If you've experienced flood damage, even if it seems minor or manageable on your own, please report it to Vermont 211. Your damage report is crucial. It helps the state assess the full impact of the flood and receive **FEDERAL RESOURCES FOR THE KINGDOM**.
- To your **INSURANCE COMPANY**. You will need to have done this prior to receiving any Federal support if that becomes available. If your claim is denied, keep a copy of your denial letter – you will need it.
- Take time-stamped **PHOTOS** and/or videos of all damage before cleaning it up. Keep all **RECEIPTS** for any equipment you buy or rent to deal with damage.

REQUEST ASSISTANCE

- By calling Crisis Cleanup **HOME CLEANUP HOTLINE: 802-242-2054** - Crisis Cleanup helps connect you with volunteers from local relief organizations like KURRVE. All services are free, but service is not guaranteed due to the overwhelming need. This hotline will remain open through Friday, July 26, 2024.
